The Gospel isn't a one-time message. It shows continual love and grace over and over again. Christian knows that better than most. You see, a little over three years ago he was addicted to crystal meth and living on the streets.

"When I was homeless, I lost contact with my friends, and my family didn't want to have anything to do with me," he says.

Even though he'd lost most of the meaningful relationships in his life, Christian had one friend who told him there was a place he could get help the Redwood Gospel Mission.

In May of 2015, Christian walked through our doors interested in one thing: food.

Six Months of Meals

For six months, Christian came to eat at the Mission and occasionally spent the night, but as soon as anyone invited him to join the New Life Program so that he could get over his addiction, he walked right out the doors.



"The guys at the front desk just kept showing me unconditional love," Christian says. "I would keep coming in, they'd keep asking me if I wanted to come to the program. I'd blow them off because all I wanted was some food or a place to stay."

Off the Streets and Into Bible College

But in those six months God worked to soften Christian's heart. One day, while passing a church, Christian decided to go in. In that moment, Christian knew he had to go back to the Mission and join the recovery program.

"Shortly after I joined, the Gospel message that I had heard hundreds of times over those six months finally hit me. I knew the calling that I had felt was the Holy Spirit, you know, and I just decided to give my life over to the Lord."

Three Times A Graduate

Christian not only graduated from the New Life Program, he was also the first to finish our Redwood Gospel Coffee Roasting Certification Program.

When he had finished his programs at the Mission, he knew he wanted to serve God with his life and work. So he went to Bible college, and graduated last April with an Associate's Degree in Applied Science in Biblical Study.

"Making the choice to give my life to Christ and to put my old life behind me is the best decision I ever made," **he says**.

About a month after Christian joined our program, his mom, who lives in another state, joined a similar program. Now she is a believer and his sister is too! He's still praying for his brother and his father to meet Jesus.


Redwood Gospel Coffee Roastery Moves Onsite

This past fall, we were able to partner with a local private company to move our coffee roaster on site here at the Mission.

The new facility, while small, is a huge blessing for a number of reasons, including:

- 1. The new location eliminates the 3-4 hour commute time to the previous roastery in Berkeley.
- 2. We're saving \$400 a month in rental costs (plus even more in travel expenses)
- 3. It's more efficient.
- 4. We're able to serve more people. Best of all:
- It's built for visitors. Now friends like you can come in for a tour to see the roastery yourself and meet the people you are helping to get important job and career training.
