When Maria came to pick up the food box, she saw Fernando, the Mission's Hispanic Partner Relations Manager, and the pastor of the church she had attended. Lina, his wife, was there too and their eyes lit up when they saw Maria.

Right then and there, over the food box, as they reconnected, Maria decided she and her family would go back to church.

"As soon as we came back, a lot of things started changing. There were a lot of blessings," Maria says.

Maria and her family know without a doubt that God works through the Thanksgiving Banquet and the meals provided by friends like you to draw them into His family – and to bring them back if they've wandered away.

## The First Time Maria Met Jesus

*"It happened to us a long time ago, too," she explains. "When we came, when we accepted Jesus, you can just see a lot of people accepting Jesus by hearing His Word and because of everybody that is just there ready to help. It's wonderful. It's something that needs to be there. There are people out there that don't know about Jesus. And through this banquet, they get to know Jesus. They get to know how Jesus loves them."*

**As I've walked around the Mission lately and talked to our staff, there's something that has blown me away that I just have to share with you:**

God has worked in people's lives in incredible ways that I knew nothing about until after He had already changed their lives! It's been a reminder to me that even in the mist of the continued pandemic, ministry persists.

God is still at work and there are countless — yes, countless — reasons to be thankful.

It reminds me of Habakkuk 1:5, *"Look at the nations and watch — and be utterly amazed. For I am going*

*to do something in your days that you would not believe, even if you were told."*

Even though this verse was likely written in the 7th century, B.C. before Jesus walked on the earth, it is still true for us today.

## Medical Partnership Thriving



It's no secret that being homeless is hard on your health. In fact, two years ago the Mission was one of the places that was high on the list of 911 calls. But thanks to a partnership with St. Joseph Medical Center, those emergency calls have gone way down.

Now, guests and our homeless neighbors can get medical care right on site through a Mobile Health Clinic.

"Through the mobile clinic itself, we serve the underserved," says Jessica, Medical Assistant at St. Joseph's.

"We go to places where people don't have insurance. We go to places where people don't have the means to get care otherwise. I've never in my life had a job like this one where we were able to serve as much as we are. It's a very rewarding feeling!"



*Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, St. Joseph's Mobile Medical Clinic was in six locations (including the Mission). Now they are in 12 and continuing to expand.*

# The Blessing of Food Boxes



As Maria's story shows, we've always given out food boxes. But this year, because we aren't able to do the Great Thanksgiving Banquet in the same way, we're aiming to provide as many food boxes as possible. That's why your gifts are so important!

Once we get all the food, it will be divided up so that poor and needy families can still enjoy a great holiday meal – in their own homes. Different sizes of boxes help ensure families of all sizes have enough for Thanksgiving dinner – and leftovers too!

“That basket, it helps so much because, let me tell you, I've known people that don't have food to eat. They have gone days without eating, and then they get a big box with the turkey, the vegetables, everything, you know?” Maria says. “Families can cook for that night... They have their food to celebrate that day. It's wonderful.”

## Food Boxes Include Items Like:

- 1 6 oz Box Stuffing Mix**
- 1 6 oz box cornbread mix**
- 1 29 oz can cut sweet potatoes**
- 2 14-15 oz canned green beans/ corn**
- 2 .67 oz packets gravy mix**
- 1 14 oz can of cranberry sauce**
- 1 21 oz can of apple pie filling or 2 15 oz cans of pumpkin pie filling**
- 1 10 oz bag of mini marshmallows**

# Showers Become Priceless During Pandemic

The Mobile Shower Ministry has been operating for 5 years. But when the pandemic hit, God began using this ministry even more. The need for daily showers immediately went up, and within seven days the shower ministry expanded to eight locations!

*“The shower ministries are really life changing for the people,”* says Grace, a shower volunteer from Bayside Church.

*“It gives them the opportunity to feel like they are now equal to anybody else walking down the street who just had a shower. In other words, it gives them hope.”*

*“We try to make it a ministry instead of just a shower,”* she continues. *“We want them to also have an opportunity to learn the Word. We’ve had about 10 people become part of the church, and their lives have totally been changed in every way, so it’s great.”*
