If you ever have the chance to talk to Philip, there are two words you're sure to hear: "Praise God!"

"If I go through a day without saying, 'Praise God!' then something's wrong. As soon as that first 'Praise God!' pops out, then I'm back on track," he says.

Philip would never have been on track at all if it weren't for friends like you. In fact, he spent 28 years completely off track - addicted to meth.

"From 2001 to 2017 I spent at least six months out of every year in jail. I was in and out like a revolving door."


Then, on October 2, 2017, when he was arrested, Philip's pretrial officer heard he was homeless. Instead of sending him back to his camp on Lynch Creek, she told him to go somewhere he'd never heard of - Redwood Gospel Mission.

When he arrived, we gave him a ham sandwich and invited him to come back that night. Later, when we walked into chapel, Philip says the Lord touched

how did you do this?' He said, 'It's not me, man. It's the Lord.' I said, 'I want a pill like that.' He said, 'Join the program,' and I joined."

Philip graduated in 2018 and now works at the Mission as a Thrift Store Clerk. He's spent several Christmas seasons with us - as a quest, program participant, volunteer and now staff member.

"Christmas at the Mission is a very, very special time," he says. "To be a part of that is to be a part of my community, and that's something I'd never experienced before."

A Short Wish List

This Christmas, Philip has one wish - to take his mom, who has always been his biggest supporter, a bucket of Kentucky Fried Chicken. A few months ago, when she caught COVID-19, he didn't even know if she'd survive to the holidays.

Instead of letting his fear pull him back to his addiction, Philip did what he was taught at the Mission - he reached out to his support group and asked them to pray. Even though it was touch and go, Philip's mom survived!

Philip is praying that by Christmas restrictions at her facility will be lifted so he can see her. But even if he can't, nothing will stop him from saying his two favorite words, "Praise God!"

Praise God indeed! Praise God for transforming Philip's life! Praise God for using friends like you to do it!

The Foolishness of Christmas

My favorite Christmas verse is 1 Corinthians 1:25, "For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength."

It's my favorite because, by all practical accounts, the entire Christmas story seems foolish. A baby born to a virgin? Impossible! And not just any baby, but the God of the universe. Why would he arrive that way? In a dirty stable, no less?

We may not notice it because we're so familiar with the story, but it keeps getting more foolish from there, culminating in the three groups that God chooses to reveal the promised Savior to first:

- 1. An unwed, teenage mother.
- 2. Shepherds working in the fields. These weren't just regular guys but the outcasts of society, who spent all their time with animals.
- 3. The Wise Men who were the ultimate outsiders aliens not even from the area.

And yet, without these most unlikely messengers, you and I wouldn't even know the Christmas story. We wouldn't have heard of Jesus' birth, and we wouldn't be able to continue to share this amazing news with others. That would have been the biggest tragedy of all of history!

So as I think of how God chooses the foolish things to shame the wise, it makes me grateful. I'm grateful for all the ways the Lord works, and all the people He uses because it reminds me that no matter what, God can still use me. I just have to be willing to share the message.

An Unexpected Opportunity

The pandemic has created all sorts of challenges, but it's also opened up new ministry opportunities. When we began partnering with Alliance Redwoods camp, one of those opportunities became the ministry of transportation.

When we moved guests to camp, we committed to making sure they still had safe transportation to their important appointments – to see doctors, visit the DMV, go to legal meetings, etc. But that meant we had to hire drivers to shuttle people back and forth.

What might have seemed like an inconvenience has become a great blessing.

The drivers all have a deep love for Jesus – several are even in professional ministry – and they have devoted the time they get in the car to connect, listen, pray and share the Gospel with the people they are driving.

"It's more than just providing a service. It's providing care and comfort for them to get to and from where they need to go. I've had a few times where there's been a couple of guests that shared

"This year's going to be really nice. It's going to be wonderful. Because the dining hall, they like to go out of their way on special holidays and do something very special for us." – Charles


