On their own, a hot meal, a slice of cake, a birthday card or a free haircut may not seem like that big of a deal.

And to many of us they are small things. But when you are experiencing homelessness, those small things can change everything – and it's not always about what those things are as much as how they make you feel.

The first time Tracy came to the Homeless Birthday Party, she felt seen for the first time in a long time.

"Being homeless was really sad, and I was in a desperate place," Tracy says. "I don't remember having birthdays when I was on the street."

That's because when you are homeless, there are no birthdays and no holidays.

Every day just blurs into the next when you are struggling to survive, wondering where your next meal will come from or facing the angry stares of people who just wish you would disappear.

So, when Tracy heard about the Homeless Birthday Party from some women that she knew, she wasn't sure what to expect. But when she got there, she was blown away.

"I walked up the sidewalk and there was a section where people were getting their haircuts, and there was a table where people were handing out bag lunches. There were toiletries and socks and all kinds of things that when you're on the street you really need," Tracy remembers.

"I could feel the kindness coming down the street, so the vibe was really strong, and I saw a lot of homeless people there and they seemed to be happy."

Some of the things that made the biggest difference to Tracy were getting some really good food, some snacks she could take with her, a few clean pairs of socks and getting her hair cut – something she hadn't done in years.

"My hair was really shaggy, and I wear bangs. It was in my face," she says. "There's something about the personal touch of a haircut that fills my heart."

No Small Thing: Why Celebrating Matters

All the little elements at the birthday party added up to one really big thing for Tracy.

"It felt like people loving on us," she says.

Feeling loved was Tracy's favorite thing about birthdays before being homeless. And to experience it again reminded her of who she was created to be.

"The biggest thing was the love," she says. "And the attention because we were celebrating that I'm alive, that my life matters, it matters to God, and it matters to other people."

Tracy went on to join our New Life Recovery Program and has gotten clean and sober and is off the streets!

"Now I am filled with the hope that recovery gives me, and the Lord gives me. I'm working, and I'm sober almost 3 years," she says.

Can We Come to Your Church?








"Happy Birthday!"

many people don't hear those words. They don't have anyone celebrating them or telling them that they're glad they are alive. That's why the Homeless Birthday Party is so important and why signing and returning the enclosed birthday card is such a big deal.

Many of us happily drop off our gently used items at the Mission Thrift Store, knowing that the profits from the sales of those items help support the Mission. But what many people don't realize is that those items can also help men and women in recovery earn their retail certification, and they can also be used to help furnish the homes of people in need. In fact, after the Santa Rosa Fires in 2017, people who were left with nothing were able to get approval to receive clothing, furniture and other items from the Thrift Store for free.

And sometimes just the act of experiencing that kind of generosity is enough to turn you to Jesus. One woman recently came into the Thrift Store in search of items for a ministry at her church. She turned to Pastor Fernando who was on site at the time and asked him if he remembered her. Three years ago, she'd come in and been blessed with specific items. Best of all, Pastor Fernando had shared the Gospel and led her to the Lord!
