When Kevin first stepped through the door of Redwood Gospel Mission, he didn't know if he'd ever talk to any of his relatives again. His struggle with addiction had pushed them so far away that he was utterly and completely alone.

Can you imagine that?

#### Nowhere Else to Turn

"I had no one left. I'd burned every bridge I had left. I had nowhere to turn to except God," he says.

At that point, Kevin had been homeless for a year. It had been over two years since he'd had communication with any of his family members.

During that time, when he ate – if he ate – it was mostly processed food. No vegetables. No fruit. His body was sluggish. He was depressed most days. The holidays, without food or family, were even worse.

#### A Meal Was the Start

Then Kevin remembered a place where he had been before. A place where he'd gotten a good meal and been able to take a shower. A place where he felt welcomed and safe.

### That place was the Redwood Gospel Mission.

"I thought, this is my last chance. This is my last chance at life, at getting my family back," Kevin says.

He joined our recovery program and discovered something he never expected – a whole new family.

"People talk about that sometimes," he says. "The RGM family – and it does feel like a family here."

### **Too Many Families to Count**

But the Mission family isn't the only family that Kevin became part of by coming here. He also met Jesus and became part of the family of God. Plus, he was welcomed into a local church family – 10 people from church came to his graduation – and was able to reconcile with his relatives!

"The first time I got to see my grandmother again was at my graduation and she totally forgave me, and we just hugged and cried," he says.

He also has a strong connection with the guys he went through the program with and considers them his brothers.

"I'm just blessed. And I have a wonderful church family and . . . lots of hope towards the future. I just finished school and I have a new career I'm getting into," he says.

#### Paul has a deep compassion for homeless people because he used to be one.

Several years ago, he was reminded of how painful it was while watching three men huddled outside a coffee shop sharing a single cup of coffee, just trying to stay warm. At that moment he knew he needed to do something to help people in need and decided to volunteer.

"I figured out who took care of the most people in town and who did it with local resources," Paul says.

His search led him to the Mission and we're so glad it did! A trained chef, Paul has been invaluable helping in our kitchen and leading other volunteers at the Thanksgiving Banquet. But he says you don't have to have any special skills to volunteer.

"Just show up and be present. You will walk away fulfilled," Paul says. "Step outside of your comfort zone because that's where real change happens. And if you want to change your life and make your life better, this is a really easy one."
