

Redwood Gospel Missions Ministries Include:

EMERGENCY SHELTER: Men, women and children experiencing homelessness are provided with warm, nutritious meals, clothing, a safe place to sleep and an opportunity to hear the Gospel.

THE CENTER FOR HOPE, UKIAH: Our day center in Ukiah is open Monday – Friday providing breakfast, coffee, showers, clothing, encouraging Gospel message, Bible study and more.

NEW LIFE PROGRAM: A faith-based residential recovery program for women with life-controlling issues who wish to put their issues behind them and start a new life.

MOBILE MINISTRIES: Mobile Ministries includes Nomadic Shelter, Search and Rescue efforts, Mobile Shower and our new Mobile Kitchen, which launched in the spring of 2023. The focus is on Luke 14:23, “And the Lord said unto the servant, ‘Go out into the highways and hedges and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled.’”

Redwood Gospel Missions Ministries cont.

JAIL MINISTRIES: Authorized volunteer teams go into the county jail to facilitate chapel services, Bible studies, one-on-one biblical support and provide preliminary interviews for inmates looking to be released into the New Life Program.

THRIFT STORES AND INDUSTRIAL MINISTRIES: We've had our Thrift Store in Santa Rosa for nearly 40 years and we are opening a Rohnert Park location early this summer. Donated items are sold to support the Missions' ongoing programs and ministries.

OUTREACH MINISTRIES: Outreach events, such as the Great Thanksgiving Banquet, Back-to-School events and the Homeless Birthday Party happen throughout the year to allow you to connect with and minister to the poor and needy.

JOB-SKILLS TRAINING PROGRAMS: Training programs change lives, giving men and women valuable training and experience in Catering, Coffee Roasting, Retail Management, Truck Driving and Forklift Operation.
