Hunger, a Restraining Order and New Life

Brandon never thought he'd be a Christian.

He never thought he'd be claiming Jesus as his Savior.

He never thought he'd be living a new life.

But he is — for two reasons. First, because God is good. Second, because friends like you are generous.

To understand how massive Brandon's transformation is, we have to go back to a time when heroin and meth were all he cared about.

Forbidden to See His Family

Brandon was so lost, so hurting and so deep in his addiction that he turned against everyone who had loved him. Things were so bad that his family put a restraining order against him.

He ended up on the street for two years.

"You spend every day just trying to feel comfortable," he says. "Getting high is the only way you can cope."

"I wouldn't eat for days, and I got down to skin and bones - just ribs . . . if I did eat, it's only because I stole something so I could eat."

Finally, Brandon got so desperate that he decided he had to come to the Mission. Once he got here, friends like you provided him with meals, safe shelter and the chance to enroll in the New Life Recovery Program.

Through those things, Brandon saw God's love and decided to give his life to Jesus.

New Life


"I never thought that I would be where I am now. I never thought I'd be a Christian. I wouldn't even know myself, just a few years ago."

Today, Brandon is living a new life. Every day he wakes up grateful for the Mission and the grace that God has poured out on him. He's working as an electrician and hopes to start attending Bible college soon. He goes to church regularly and has a stable hope.

"If it wasn't for the Mission, I would be either in prison or dead or still homeless," he says. "The biggest blessing of all is that the Lord is there and the Lord is doing His work there. That's where I was saved. And that's where my entire life - and not just my life but my eternity - has been totally changed."

The restraining order has been tossed out and Brandon has reconnected with everyone in his family. He loves spending holidays with them and will likely get to celebrate Easter with them this year!

Tim Stafford has been volunteering as a mentor in our men's program for about 10 years, and the impact it's had on him has been personal, profound and life changing.


