Beyond the Mission Walls Roseanna never went through She never stayed here for

any of our recovery programs. more than a few nights at a time. But she came to several of our outreach events. Every time, she felt loved, closer to God and encouraged to keep taking steps towards a new life.

"When you're homeless, you don't want to miss a Redwood Gospel Mission event," she says.

And it wasn't just that she could get a good, hot meal at those events. It was that when she was there, she felt God's love. It fed her soul and gave her hope to keep going.

Roseanna Didn't Expect to Be Homeless

"I was previously married for 14 years and owned my house for 10 years," she says.

But then, Roseanna's husband turned violent. She called the police, and he went to jail. But without his income, she couldn't keep up with the house payments.

"That got me eight years homeless on the street," she says.

One of the events she went to most of those years was our Homeless Birthday Party, which we hold every year.

Seven Years of Birthday Parties

"I probably went there maybe six or seven out of all the years I was homeless," she says. "You don't want to miss an event where you're getting barbecue, a chance to win a bike and maybe get a haircut."

The first time Roseanna came, she thought the party was for the Mission - that we were celebrating our birthday. But then, she realized it was for her.

"You felt the love, the joy. It was a big party really meant for you," she says. "It's a very worthy cause because a lot of people who are homeless lose their family members ... So for that day to be able to celebrate you, it's huge and the impact that you have on that person could be a life changer."

In addition to the Homeless Birthday Party, Roseanna attended the Great Thanksgiving Banquet and took advantage of as many other outreach events as she could.

Finally, after eight years of being homeless, she was willing to stop trying to fix the problem herself and asked for help.

"My last resort was finally going into a shelter, which I didn't want to do because I thought I was self-sufficient ... but you learn as you go," Roseanna shares.

After asking for help, Roseanna was able to connect with additional services in our area, get a great job and move into a new home.

If We Don't Go, Who Will?

"I'd tell people to keep doing what you're doing. It makes an impact where you least expect it. It brings people to Christ. It shows Christ's love. It shows who Christ is, what He's about, why He came."

Mobile Shower Ministry Expands

"We were overloyed that we had the opportunity to bring it here to Rohnert Park," Paula, one of the co-founders of Unsheltered Friends, says. "The people appreciate it so much . . . They can come, and they can get their physical needs met and also we can look for opportunities to talk about spiritual needs."

"We're showing them the love of God and just letting them know that they're valued and that God loves them and that we love them and that we care and that people care. It really starts a lot of people thinking."
