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# The Beauty of Jesus Math

In Jesus math, 2 + 2 doesn't always equal 4. And that's the beauty of it. Instead of always being logical, there's room for miracles.

"I mean, it doesn't make any sense why I'm still alive now," Michael says. "Obviously God had bigger plans for me. I like to call it Jesus math. It doesn't add up that I am still here through all the accidents and the surgeries and just close calls with death that I have had."

### Logically, He Shouldn't be Alive

Michael been drinking and using drugs for so long that he didn't really know how to function without them – even though he wanted to get clean.

"I was always trying to do it on my own. I was tired of being miserable on the streets and wanting, feeling like I would rather die than move forward."

Thankfully, he heard about the Mission.

"It was a safe place to be, it was a warm meal. It was a place you could shower and get clean and (Continued inside...)







have a bed, I wasn't even aware there was a program when I got there.

"It wasn't until I came to the Mission, and I added God to the equation that things changed," Michael says. "I went from being homeless and trying to drink myself to death to being genuinely happy. I don't even recognize the person that I was going in. Because I'm not that person. It's literally a new creation has come out of that."

One thing about Michael that hasn't changed is his love of cooking.

"My first job was dishwashing for Guy Fieri at Johnny Garlic's," he says. "I got into cooking when I turned 16 and legally could handle food. And I worked for Guy for a couple years and got the basics of cooking. And then I went into fine dining."

### A Life-Changing Thanksgiving

Michael first came to the Mission right before Thanksgiving, and when we learned about his culinary background, we asked if he'd help cook for the holiday.

"It was really the first time I had a Thanksgiving and a purpose in it," he says. "So I was able to cook and give back. It felt good."

A week after that Thanksgiving, Michael joined the New Life Program.

"I don't know where I'd be at without the Mission... I don't have the words to express how grateful I am for what they've done."

This Thanksgiving he's three years sober, off the streets, married, walking with Jesus and working here at the Mission, helping us feed 4,000 people all on one day - plus hundreds every day before Thanksgiving and after, too.

"Not only does it give people on the streets a good meal, it gives them a sense of family and a place to be," Michael says. "It not only changes lives, it saves them."


Why? Because it's a demonstration of God's love. And that changes lives today and saves them for all eternity.
