Saving Grace

Before coming to the Mission, Jonathan felt trapped and hopeless.

"My life was controlled by idols, or alcohol and drugs," he says.

His addiction started early – when he was only 13. While he didn't want to blame anyone, we all know that family origin can be a part of it, especially with someone so young.

For 20 years, Jonathan lived a life he hated. His relationship with his family was strained at best.

"Everything was broken, all my bridges were burned, and no one wanted to be around me," he remembers. "I'd be able to hold down a job for a month or two, but I always selfsabotaged."

Wanting to get clean wasn't Jonathan's problem.

The Missing Piece

"I had gone through other programs like two or three times, 30-day programs. I had done six-month outpatient programs through the county...

... I knew that my disease needed something more. something different, and I found it at the Redwood Gospel Mission."

"It's God, it's Jesus. Accepting Jesus as my Lord and Savior," Jonathan says.

At first, Jonathan was just glad he wasn't on the streets anymore.

"I was at a point in my life where I was just grateful to have something to eat," he says.

But as Jesus captured his heart, his gratitude grew and all the people who had been avoiding him now wanted to be part of his life.

A Broken Family Restored

"I've restored all my relationships, and the number one that I needed to restore was my relationship with God.

And then all the other ones just fell into place, and especially with my son."

In fact, Jonathan's son, Jacob, who is 51/2, got to spend Christmas with his dad last year! And this year, Jonathan has full custody. The two of them recently moved into an apartment.

"He's got his dad showing up for him. He's got his dad right there in his corner . . . that's who I've been fighting for. Not just myself, but for my son."

The relationship with Jonathan's son isn't the only one that's been restored.

"I have great relationships with my mom and my dad and my two younger brothers," he says.

This Christmas, Jonathan is looking forward to celebrating with family. He knows that wouldn't be possible without Jesus Christ, the Mission and friends like you.

forward and back out into society and be
productive," he says.

Jeff continues to serve as a coach as well as with our Nomadic Shelter and our comfort ministries. Helping to wash feet at our Christmas Feast is one of his favorite ways to serve.
