Lilian heard about the City Kids Back-to-School Festivals from her pastor. As a single mom, she struggles to provide school supplies for her children.



Lilian and her three kids have been blessed by friends like you. Your generosity has provided backpacks filled with school supplies for Veronica, Gecelle and Jason.

"I'm a single mom. I don't have anybody to help me with my kids," Lilian says. "This is very good for me because I don't have much extra money to spend on backpacks and supplies for three children."

Getting supplies and new backpacks plus clothes and haircuts for three children can add up to several hundred dollars, and that's just not something that Lilian can afford, even working full-time.

"I Can't Give Them Everything"

"Sometimes my children are disappointed because I can't give them everything they want and need. My salary just isn't enough," Lilian says.

Lilian has always wanted her kids to go to college, and now that they are getting the most out of their primary education, she believes they will. Your support is a huge part of that!


"Thank you very much for your help," Lilian says. "It's very important for my family because I don't have any other resources."

Your gift today will provide Lilian's children (as well as hundreds of others in Sonoma County) with the backpacks and school supplies they simply can't afford on their own.


What a blessing you are to them and our entire community!

Grant's Experience

For most people, living out of your car for 24 hours doesn't sound like fun – even if it's for

a great cause. But when Grant's son-in-law called him last year and said he'd planned to take his kids to our 24 In Your Car event but wasn't able to, Grant jumped at the chance.



24 In Your Car is a great way to build compassion and teach people of all ages what it really means to be homeless.

Grant arrived with the kids not sure what to expect and left amazed at what he learned.

"They had things to not just keep you busy, but to teach you something, and put you in the shoes of a homeless person."

"You have to go around and find a bathroom, somewhere to plug your cell phone in, figure out where to get a shower or find a meal. I also made up about a dozen homeless kit bags, in a Ziploc bag. I kept those in a bucket in the backseat of my truck and so when I'd see somebody on the corner, I would give them that," Grant says. "I just gave my last one away."

The Biggest Eye Opener

"The biggest eye opener for me at 24 In Your Car was touring the shelter at Redwood Gospel Mission and learning that homelessness isn't so much about not having a shelter or a roof over your head. It's about lack of relationships."

"A lot of people are reluctant to make commitments where they have to show up every week or every month or something, but try 24 In Your Car because it's like a variety pack of what the Redwood Gospel Mission does and you get a little taste of each different part of the ministry. This year we're expecting 2,000 children plus their families.


The Festivals Include:


Backpack Tags
