How Meals Saved Kelly's Life

Kelly didn't know it, but before she came to the Mission, her family often wondered when she'd take her last breath.

"I was very emaciated," she says. "My hair was falling out and I weighed 100 pounds."

100 pounds was not a healthy weight for Kelly. Nothing about her life was healthy and it hadn't been for a long time.

Kelly began drinking when she was around 18, but for years she kept it under control. Then, when her beloved husband died, the grief was too much to bear.

"It was just like a bomb went off," Kelly remembers. "There was such grief, and I tried to shove it down with vodka and beer."

As the months went on, Kelly drank more and ate less. She lost her job and was evicted . . .

... from her house, which is how she ended up coming to our door.

Radical Hospitality

Only hoping for a safe place to sleep, Kelly was blown away by how she was treated.

"They would bring this food, and I'd be like, 'Wow!'" she remembers. "It helped me realize that there were people that really, really wanted me to be ok."

Each meal Kelly ate strengthened her body and mind, helping her realize she wanted to change her life. Within two weeks, she was in our New Life Program.

"Before, I believed in God, in Jesus, but I didn't have a relationship with them," Kelly says.

Today she does. Not only does she have a relationship with Jesus, she is finding ways to share His love with others by volunteering, telling her story, and going back to school!

"It's hard to even express how much the Mission has changed my life," Kelly says.


Kelly graduated from the Mission's program in 2023 and last May earned a certificate in Drug and Alcohol Counseling. She's also reconnected with her family and when her daughter moved back to the area, they even decided to move in together!

Happy, Healthy and Healed

"I'm grandmother and I'm allowed to be around my grandson, I'm not sure I would have that relationship with him or my daughter if I hadn't gotten sober," Kelly says. "I cannot thank or uplift the Mission more. I know it's saved my life."

"I'm not 100 pounds anymore...I am happy and healthy."


We've had that light for 62 years. We're known for it. So much so that when it's obvious someone is in need, they are often pointed towards our light.


"Just go to Railroad Square and walk towards the bright neon light," people say. "That's where you'll find the help you need."
